

Foot O' Leith Walk – Elm Row - Carriageway Remedial Works from 10th January 2011

A series of carriageway remedial works on the traffic management are required between the Foot O' Leith Walk and Elm Row and are planned to commence 10th January 2011. These works are considered low impact and involve the installation/removal and amendments to traffic management signage.

The following table describes the works due to commence 10th January 2011;

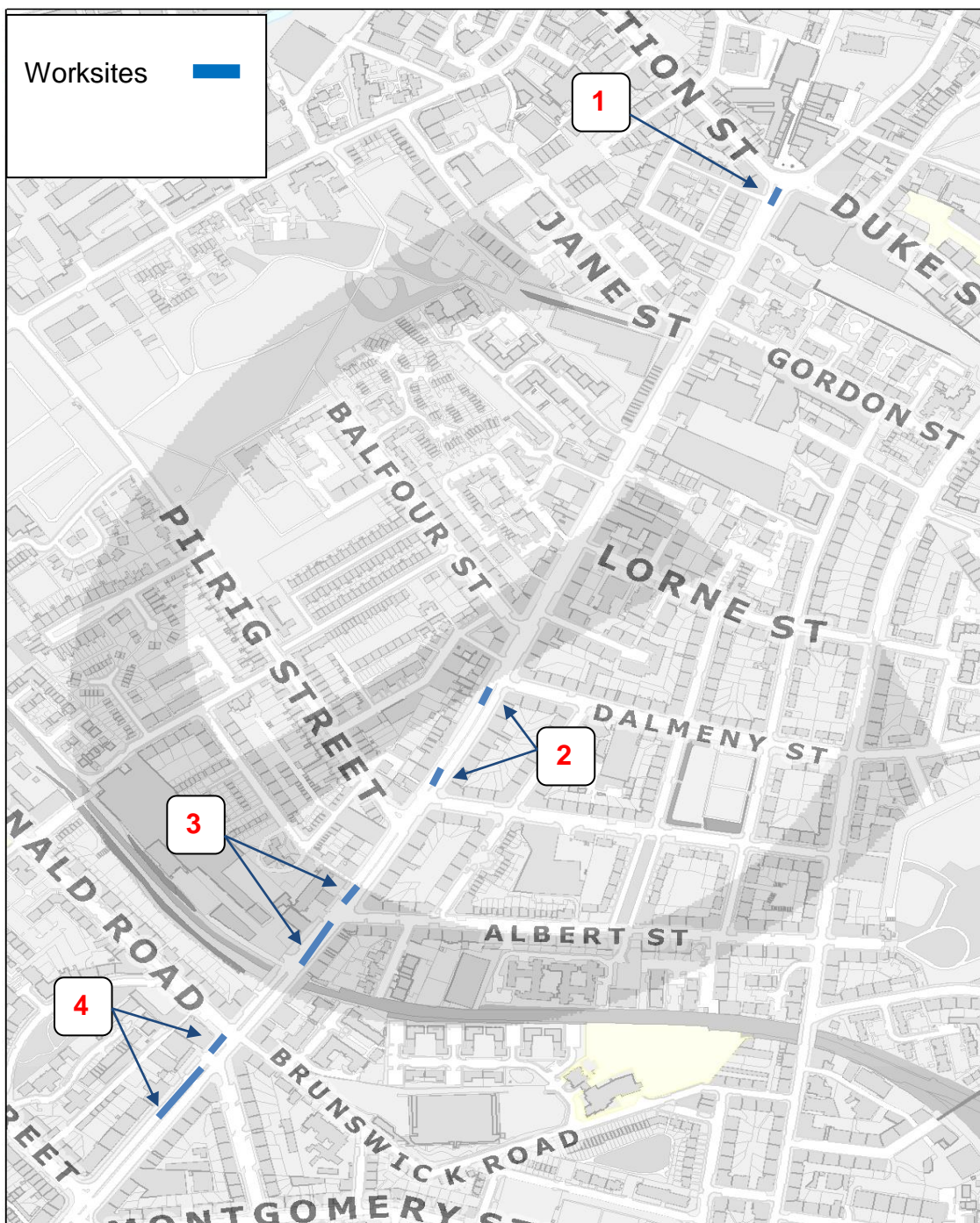
In addition to the carriageway remedial works, there will be a programme of Scottish Water abandonments on the aged water main network. The programme dates for these works are still to be agreed with Scottish Water and the contractor; however, it is important that I bring these to your attention as soon as possible.

Scottish Water works will take place at several locations between Casselbank Street and Baxters Place :

Locations:-

- Casselbank Street
- Crown Street
- Steads Place
- Springfield Street
- Jameson Place
- Albert Street
- Brunswick Street
- Elm Row
- Baxters Place
